Current Status of the Army National Guard

The Army National Guard is located in 50 states, 3 territories, and the District of Columbia. There are over 3000 National Guard units throughout the US and its territories.

Who to contact in the US Army National Guard about family programs

First contact the State Program Coordinator then find out about the National Guard Family Assistance Centers (FAC) in your state by going to www.guardfamily.org or contact the Army Outreach Liaison Specialists (OLS). Look under community centers to locate FACs.

FACs are centers located throughout each state where National Guard and other military families can locate resources and are coordination points for services during times of deployment or war. There are approximately 400 FACs to serve all National Guard family members from any military service.

State Program Coordinators mission is to empower families through communication, education, and training, to become more self-reliant, thus enabling the Service members to focus on successful mission accomplishment.

Current Status of the Army Reserve

The Army Reserve has a Federal presence in over 1000 local communities, Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, and Europe. Over 150,000 Army Reserve and National Guard members are deployed around the globe. Reserve Members account for 54% of the military.

Who to Contact in the Army Reserve about Family Programs

First contact the Family Program Directors (FPD) at the Regional Readiness Commands (RRC). If you cannot reach FPD then contact the Army Outreach Liaison Specialist (OLS) or the USARC Family program staff for assistance.

FPDs direct family programs and provide assistance, guidance, and support that enhances the well-being of members of the Army Reserve family (soldiers, families, civilian employees, and retirees) during peacetime and upon mobilization.

Army Accessions Command

Accessions Command is a subordinate command of Training and Doctrine Command. Accessions Command is comprised of Cadet Command and Recruiting Command. Accessions Command is charged with providing integrated command and control of the recruiting and initial military training for the Army's officer, warrant officer and enlisted forces. Designed to meet the human resource needs of the Army from first handshake to first unit of assignment, the command transforms volunteers into soldiers and leaders for the Army.

Current Status of Accessions Command

Cadet Command is located on 272 college campuses employing 3061 Senior ROTC personnel. Recruiting Command is comprised of 1713 Recruiting stations across the USA employing 12,134 military personnel.
